## SomeONE had a Great Idea...

- Staff nutritionist recognized need to encourage dieticians in training to enter the public health workforce
  - Service expansion
  - "Real-life" training experience
  - Opportunity to "sell" public health nutrition
- Preceptorship in Public Health Dietetics created with University of Alabama Department of Human Nutrition





## **Academic Health Department Formed**

- Evolved naturally from the recognition of the intimate link that exists between academic public health and public health practice, as well as the shared benefits that can result from this linkage
- Fueled by early successes with academic agencies with nutrition students
- Formalized with Affiliation Agreements and contracts





## **Affiliation Agreement**

Affiliation Agreement between UAB's School of Public Heath (SoPH) and Jefferson County Department of Health (JCDH) in 1994

- Created a Joint Advisory Committee
  - Provides counsel regarding SoPH and JCDH interactions and fosters a close working relationship inclusive of:
    - » Appointment of JCDH personnel as adjunct SoPH faculty
    - » SoPH faculty assignment to responsibilities at JCDH
    - » Student activities such as Internships and Field Projects
    - » Job Placement
    - » Technical Assistance and Curriculum Consultation
    - » Research Collaboration
    - » Information Exchange

## Success Breeds Success: Pharmacy Residency in Public Health

First Pharmacy/Public Health Residency in US

- Established in 2004 with the Samford University McWhorter School of Pharmacy
  - Fifteen residents have completed this program
  - Two residents are currently participating as PGY 1s
- Program transitioning to a PGY 2 in July 2016
  - Two residents





# Additional Training Support Provided to Academic Partners

JCDH staff provide additional training support for academic partners:

- Training for pharmacy residents on adverse drug event detection, monitoring, and management
- Adjunct faculty and guest lecturers for UAB School of Public Health and other UAB undergraduate and graduate programs
- Preceptors for the Samford University McWhorter School of Pharmacy residents





# Success Breeds Success: Clinical Nurse Practitioner Residency

- Co-created with the UAB School of Nursing for Fall 2016 enrollment
  - One-year post-graduate, mentored training in Adult Primary Care
  - Potential for continued employment
  - Two residency positions available





## **Service Expansion and Enhancement**

Written agreements and contracts to expand/enhance service provision

- UAB Division of Infectious Disease contract provides additional physician and support for JCDH's STD Program (1994 – present)
- UAB's School of Optometry contract provides vision screening and ocular disease services (1996 – present)
- UAB School of Dentistry contract provides specialty dental services (1997 – present)
- McWhorter School of Pharmacy contract provides medication and lifestyle modification instruction (2002 – present)

# **AHD Success Story #2**

Partnership with the McWhorter School of Pharmacy over the past 12 months has resulted in:

- Improvement in Clinical Outcomes for Patients with High Risk Diabetes
  - A1c reduction of 2.6%
- Prevention of conversion to diabetes for patients with pre-diabetes
  - <10% conversion rate
- Implementation of a Naloxone Clinic
  - 156 Naloxone Kits distributed in 6 months
    - 78 healthcare providers or law enforcement representatives trained in kit use





# Academic Health Department (AHD) Attributes

- Involvement between at least one academic institution and health department
- Formal written partnership agreements between institutions
- Shared personnel
- Organizational structures allowing cross-institutional resource sharing
- Exchange of resources



# **AHD Attributes (continued)**

- Collaboration to provide education and training for students and public health professionals grounded in public health theory and practice
- Joint proposal and implementation of research projects
- Shared support for and participation in public health service provision
- Collaborative and mutually beneficial relationships

- Take advantage of the AHD Mentorship Program

- It's not always a smooth road and progress isn't always linear
- Embedding an AHD as part of your organizational strategic plan can accelerate movement
- Leveraging academic health department relationships for accreditation is efficient and effective
